The Sagebrush Penguin Project's production of Disney's Aladdin Jr. is set to hit the stage June 7th through the 9th at the Susan Powell Auditorium, with Friday and Saturday's performance at 7:30, and a Sunday matinee at 2:30. Tickets are \$10 for adults and \$5 for students.

The Penguin Project began in Peoria, IL and has evolved to a national program with dozens of replication sites across the United States—Elk City is one of three in Oklahoma. Roles are filled with young artists with developmental disabilities including down syndrome, cerebral palsy, autism, intellectual disabilities, learning disabilities, visual impairments, hearing impairment, and other neurological disorders.

Actors are accompanied on stage by a group of mentors—children of relatively the same age without disabilities who have volunteered to help the artist every step of the way—from line memorization and choreography to providing moral support and simply being a friend.

CHRISTIANS AFTER GOD'S OWN HEART

Earlier this month an Aerojet plane flight was struck by lightning. While attempting to make an emergency landing in Moscow, the rear burst into flames, killing 41. The fear in the hearts of the passengers must have been overwhelming.

Disturbing facts, however, have emerged concerning the plane's emergency evacuation. According to Bill McCree, USA Today, May 7th, "Reports from people on the plane indicate the evacuation may have been slowed by passengers grabbing their bags. Videos show passengers taking their carry-on bags with them as they exited the plane," the AFA said in a statement. "We will never know if more lives could have been saved if the bags were left behind" (online edition, "Were lives lost at the cost of carry-ons in Aerojet plane crash that killed 41?"). This is unimaginable to me.

Visualize yourself being in this life-threatening situation. What would you do? Grab your bags or leave them behind? Jesus said, "Take heed, and beware of covetousness for a man's life consisteth not in the abundance of the things which he possesseth" (Luke 12:15). This verse is clear that those who would grab their bags, delaying the emergency exit and costing lives, are the very one's Jesus is convicting. While we may be amazed at the thought of their seemingly greedy decision, Scripture teaches greed can have the same devastating effects in other situations in our own lives and the lives of those we influence.

Such, according to Paul, can be a "snare," "hurtful lusts," plunging men into "destruction and perdition" that pierces them "with many sorrows" (1 Timothy 6:9-10). What is Paul's inspired counsel concerning such matters? "Fee these things" (1 Timothy 6:11).

An inordinate desire and pursuit of material things can damage not only ourselves, but also others we influence. Children, grandchildren, and others, whether we realize it or not, are observing what we value most, and what gets our pronounced attention and affection. There is another who is observing too: Almighty God with His all-seeing eyes (Proverbs 15:3).

The stakes are higher than whether one exits an airplane alive or not. It's all about how we leave this world and enter the next one. We must be keenly aware that this world can influence our judgment in the negative. We must be keenly aware that God can influence our judgment in the positive. We must keep this eternal perspective. —Brian L. Berry


