For the purpose of complying with 74 O.S. § 212, we have performed the following procedures for June 3, 2008:

- Review bank reconciliations, visually verify certificates of deposit, and confirm investments.
- Determine whether subsidiary records reconcile to the general ledger.
- Review pledged collateral securing deposits and invested funds.
