Dear Ms. Laster:

For the purpose of complying with 74 O.S. § 212, we have performed the following procedures:

- Determine whether bank reconciliations are properly performed, visually verify the certificates of deposit, and confirm the investments.
- Determine whether subsidiary records are reconciled to the general ledger.
- Determine whether deposits and invested funds are secured by pledged collateral.

All information included in the bank reconciliations, the investment ledger, the subsidiary ledgers, and the general ledger is the representation of the County Treasurer.

Our county treasurer statutory engagement was limited to the procedures performed above and was less in scope than an audit performed in accordance with generally accepted auditing standards. Accordingly, we do not express an opinion on any basic financial statement of McCurtain County.

Based on our procedures performed, we have presented our findings in the accompanying schedule.

This report is intended for the information and use of the management of the County. This restriction is not intended to limit the distribution of this report, which is a matter of public record.

SCHEDULE OF FINDINGS AND RESPONSES

Finding 2015-01 – Subsidiary Ledgers Not Reconciled to General Ledger

Condition: The following exception was noted:

- Reconciliation was not performed between the general ledger, cities and towns, schools, and votech ledgers.
 - An unidentified variance of \$13,408.84 was noted for cities and towns.
 - An unidentified variance of \$56,061.30 was noted for schools.
 - An unidentified variance of \$54,426.98 was noted for vo-tech.

Cause of Condition: Procedures have not been designed to monitor subsidiary accounts to the general ledger.

Effect of Condition: This condition could result in incomplete and inaccurate amounts being reported on the general and subsidiary ledgers.

Recommendation: The Oklahoma State Auditor & Inspector's Office recommends that the cities and towns, schools, and vo-tech subsidiary ledgers be maintained and reconciled to the general ledger on a monthly basis.

Management Response: I will work on this. There has been a balance on this for years. Hopefully I will get this finished soon.

Criteria: Safeguarding controls are an aspect of internal control. Safeguarding controls relate to the prevention or timely detection of unauthorized transactions and unauthorized access to assets. Failure to perform tasks that are part of internal controls, such as maintaining subsidiary ledgers and reconciling them to the general ledger, are deficiencies in internal control.



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
