TO THE OKLAHOMA STATE BOARD OF EXAMINERS OF PERFUSIONISTS

We have applied the procedures enumerated below to certain aspects of internal control for the period July 1, 2002 through June 30, 2003.

- 4. We reviewed management's internal controls over financial records and operations, and performed a walk-through of controls to determine whether they have been designed as represented by management. We reviewed controls in the following specific areas:
- e. Cash receipting and depositing of funds.
- f. Fixed Assets.
- g. Recording of cash receipts, disbursement of funds, and reconciliation of funds.
- h. Segregation of duties regarding authorization, recording, and custody.
 - 5. We reviewed procedures for remitting required portions of fees to the State of Oklahoma and tested a sample of remittances for adherence to these procedures.
 - 6. We reviewed the Board's policies and procedures and tested compliance with such policies and procedures in the following specific areas:
 - c. Agency's compliance with policies and procedures regarding budgetary matters.
 - d. Agency's compliance with policies and procedures regarding personnel and payroll issues such as attendance record keeping, compensation increases, and annual evaluations.

The purpose of these procedures was to identify the internal controls designed or developed by the Oklahoma State Board of Examiners of Perfusionists, make recommendations in certain areas, and determine whether stated controls were operating as represented to us or if additional controls were necessary to reduce the risk of errors and irregularities.

Our procedures were more limited than would be necessary to express an opinion on any of the items referred to above or to express an opinion on the effectiveness of the Board's internal control or any part thereof. Accordingly, we do not express such opinions. Alternatively, we have identified the procedures we performed and the findings resulting from those procedures. Had we performed additional procedures or had we made an audit of the effectiveness of the Board's internal control, other matters might have come to our attention that would have been reported to you.

COMMENTS AND RECOMMENDATIONS

Comment 2003-343-001

Criteria: The Oklahoma Perfusionist Policy 100 states in part: "It shall be the policy of the Oklahoma State Board of Examiners of Perfusionist that the following information be submitted on forms provided by the Board when applying for licensure or provisional licensure. Information required: (m) Felony arrest or conviction".

Condition: Upon inquiry, it came to our attention that the Perfusionist Board does not use a criminal investigation agency such as the Oklahoma State Bureau of Investigation (OSBI) to perform criminal background checks on applicants. They do use a private agency that conducts a background check on those applicants previously registered in another state. However, this limits the population to those who have already registered with another licensure board.

Effect: There are no controls in place to ensure that applicants have not been finally convicted of any crime involving moral turpitude or of any felony.

Recommendation: We recommend the Perfusionist Board require applicants to submit a copy of a recent OSBI criminal history record search with their application for licensure.
