The Edmond Police Department was approved for a grant from the Oklahoma Highway Safety Office (Grant # STMC-20-02-06-22) in the amount of \$79,500 for the period of October 1, 2019 through September 30, 2020. The purpose of this grant is to allow the Department to continue implementing a 2 phase Motorcycle Safety Program, including: 1) a Motorcycle Awareness Program that will provide public awareness, public service announcements and other outreach programs to enhance driver awareness of motorcyclists, such as the "Share the Road" safety messages developed and using Share-the Road model language; and 2) the expansion and delivery of a Motorcyclist Safety Curricula for the purpose of educating motorcycle riders in the safe operation of motorcycles. This is the eleventh year for Edmond's program and will include instruction in the area of sport bikes and cruiser bikes. Funds are provided for overtime, equipment, promotional items, travel, training and maintenance expenses. The Oklahoma Highway Safety Office has awarded this grant on an expenditure driven basis therefore this supplemental is needed to fund the expenses until they are reimbursed.

Over the past years as city staff has increased to meet the demands of our growing city the Planning and Public Works building (PPW) has become overcrowded and there is a need for more office space to better office the existing staff and to hire additional staff needed. The PPW building currently offices the departments of Building Services, Planning, Engineering, the ITS Traffic Management Center and the ACM of Operations. To create the office space needed for current and future staff the Building Services Department will move into the new DCC office space after renovations are completed. Approve a supplemental appropriation for the Railroad Quiet Zone Project; \$250,000.

#### **Background**

When the Council recently approved the Railroad Quiet Zone project, I inadvertently did not double check the budget availability in the 2000 Capital Improvement Sales Tax in the Street category. You know we have had construction projects exceed our estimates in this area and I should have double checked the budget authorization. To proceed with the Quiet Zone project we need to increase the budget authority by \$250,000 to cover this expense.

We have a number of construction projects that are working there way to bid and will have an impact on which budget year they occur as we approach the end of the year. We may have more adjustments to the 2000 CIP and the 2017 CIP as we work the current year revisions and future budgets with the CIP Advisory Board. Those budget revisions will be considered by that group at their April meeting and recommended to the City Council.
