Approval of a Supplemental Appropriation for a Parking Garage associated with The Silos; \$3,500,000.

Background

At the July 12, 2021 City Council meeting a Development and Financing Assistance Agreement for The Silos was approved. A part of the agreement committed the City to pay \$3.5M for a parking garage. The parking garage will contain 346 spaces, 48 of those will be dedicated public spaces, and the remaining 298 will be reserved for use by the tenants of The Silos. The City will own the garage and The Silos will pay \$4M to lease the 298 stalls for a term of 20 years with the option to extend for an additional 20 years. They will then have the option to purchase the garage for an agreed upon price that is spelled out in the Development Agreement.

When the agreement was approved the City was still exploring options for how to best pay the \$3.5M. After consultation with multiple departments and examining the Final Rule of the American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA), it was identified the best option is to use funds in Edmond Electric. Over the life of the 20-year Property Tax TIF, Edmond Electric will be repaid the full amount from TIF revenue generated off The Silos.

As a reminder. The Silos will be a 276 unit multi-family project located in downtown directly west of the RR tracks generally between Main St and 1st St. They are anticipating a ground breaking in the next 30-45 days with construction to last 18-24 months.

Background

This item would move money currently in reserves in the 2017 Capital Improvements Sales Tax to pay for the Right Of Wav (ROW) costs associated with the Creek Bend Trail (background below). This expense was not budgeted in the current fiscal year as it wasn't anticipated all the necessary steps to acquire ROW would be accomplished prior to June 30, 2022. However, it's a pleasant surprise that has occurred and a few offers have already been accepted. The acceptance of those offers will be on future City Council agenda.

Additional Background

The trail will connect to the Spring Creek Trail near I-35, follow along Spring Creek and ultimately end at Coltrane (visual attached). The 1.2 mile long trail will be 14' wide so as to allow for multi-use (walking, running, biking, etc.) The design of the trail is 30% complete and the city has received a \$600,000 grant from the Oklahoma Department of Transportation for the estimated \$3,000,000 trail. The project is currently undergoing an environmental assessment and it's anticipated the design will be 100% complete in December 2022.

There are 10 different parcels that need to be acquired including a larger one that has frontage off of Coltrane that staff envisions as a small parking lot for a trail head. The ultimate vision for this project is not only a trail. but to create a linear park and in order to do this we need to acquire more ROW then if it was just a trail. Think of the trail as the first phase of a multi-phase project.

Staff anticipates acquiring all the ROW needed over the next several months, proceeding with design and beginning construction sometime during the summer of 2023 (Fiscal Year 22/23). The proposed 5 year Capital Improvement Sales Tax budget has money allocated in FY 22/23 for trail construction.

Discussion and Consideration of Supplemental Appropriation for Kickingbird Golf Course Project; \$650,000.

Background

*The improvements to Kickingbird Golf Course are progressing nicely - the clubhouse portion of the project is roughly 50% complete and the greens, irrigation, and other course improvements is closer to 70% complete. Like with most construction projects of this scale there have been unanticipated items that require additional money (Ex: a very old water well line that was hit by the contractor because we did not have accurate information as to its location - \$35K). There have also been things that are considered "value adds" that weren't in the original scope of the project, but that staff feels are prudent to complete in order to have the best possible facility when it re-opens (Ex: reshaping, resodding, and laser-leveling all of our existing tee boxes rather than just the 30% in the original scope - \$189K).

The contract that was approved with Lippert Brothers (Clubhouse) and Mid-America Golf (Golf Course) on July 12, 2021 was for almost \$18M and approved change orders to date total \$523K. Staff anticipates another \$277K for in known change orders for the clubhouse portion of the project and an additional \$317K for the golf course (\$594K), but is requesting roughly \$56K more than that in case other unforeseen circumstances arrive. While staff is hopeful these circumstances do not come to pass, and will make no more value added changes to the project, we feel it's appropriate to request the additional \$56K so as not to slow down the project should something arise.

Background

Normally, Edmond Electric replaces its fleet vehicles on a ten year cycle. Historically, once ordered, vehicles were delivered within eight months to a year. Recently, lead times for some replacement vehicles has stretched out to two to three years. Due to these extended delivery lead times, Electric is retaining vehicles past the ten year replacement cycle which has added to maintenance costs.

Additionally, the cost for parts and material has increased more than expected when the budget was prepared.

Due to these unexpected vehicle maintenance costs, current funding will not be enough to cover the maintenance costs of vehicles for the remainder of the fiscal year. Consequently, staff is requesting a Supplemental for vehicle maintenance charges, (\$80,000.00) to resolve this issue. This Supplemental will increase the overall Vehicle Maintenance budget.
