***Report on the Financial Statements***

We have audited the accompanying fund type and account group financial statements-regulatory basis of Cordell Independent School District No. 78, Oklahoma, as of and for the year ended June 30, 2015, and the related notes to the financial statements, which collectively comprise Cordell Independent School District No. 78, Oklahoma's basic financial statements as listed in the table of contents.

***Management's Responsibility for the Financial Statements***

Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of these financial statements in accordance with the accounting and financial reporting regulations prescribed or permitted by the Oklahoma State Department of Education as described in Note 1. Management is also responsible for the design, implementation, and maintenance of internal control relevant to the preparation and fair presentation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error.

***Auditor's Responsibility***

Our responsibility is to express an opinion on these financial statements based on our audit. We conducted our audit in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America and the standards applicable to financial audits contained in Government Auditing Standards, issued by the Comptroller General of the United States. Those standards require that we plan and perform the audit to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements are free from material misstatement.

An audit involves performing procedures to obtain audit evidence about the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements. The procedures selected depend on the auditor's judgment, including the assessment of the risks of material misstatement of the financial statements, whether due to fraud or error. In making those risk assessments, the auditor considers internal control relevant to the entity's preparation and fair presentation of the financial statements in order to design audit procedures that are appropriate in the circumstances, but not for the purpose of expressing an opinion on the effectiveness of the entity's internal control. Accordingly, we express no such opinion. An audit also includes evaluating the appropriateness of accounting policies used and the reasonableness of significant accounting estimates made by management, as well as evaluating the overall presentation of the financial statements.

We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our audit opinions.

***Basis for Adverse Opinion on U.S. Generally Accepted Accounting Principles***

As discussed in Note 1, Cordell Independent School District No. 78, Oklahoma, prepares its financial statements in conformity with the accounting and financial reporting regulations prescribed or permitted by the Oklahoma State Department of Education, which is a comprehensive basis of accounting other than accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America. The differences between the regulatory basis of accounting and accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America are also described in Note 1. The effects on the financial statements of the variances between the regulatory basis of accounting described in Note 1 and accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America, although not reasonably determinable, are presumed to be material.

***Adverse Opinion on U.S. Generally Accepted Accounting Principles***

In our opinion, because of the School's policy to prepare its financial statements on the basis of accounting discussed in the Basis for Adverse Opinion on U.S. Generally Accepted Accounting Principles paragraph, the financial statements referred to above do not present fairly, in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America, the financial position of Cordell Independent School District No. 78, Oklahoma, as of June 30, 2015, or the results of its operations for the year then ended.

***Basis for Qualified Opinion on Regulatory Basis of Accounting***

As discussed in Note 1, the financial statements referred to above do not include the General Fixed Asset Account Group, which is a departure from the accounting and financial reporting regulations prescribed or permitted by the Oklahoma State Department of Education. The amount that should be recorded in the General Fixed Asset Account Group is not known.

***Qualified Opinion on Regulatory Basis of Accounting***

However, in our opinion, except for the omission of the general fixed asset account group as discussed in the Basis for Qualified Opinion on Regulatory Basis of Accounting paragraph, the financial statements referred to above present fairly, in all material respects, the cash and unencumbered cash balances arising from regulatory basis transactions of each fund type and account group of Cordell Independent School District No. 78, Oklahoma, as of June 30, 2015, and the revenues it received and expenditures it paid and encumbered for the year then ended, on the regulatory basis of accounting described in Note 1.

***Other Matters***

***Other Information***

Our audit was conducted for the purpose of forming an opinion on the fund type and account group financial statements that collectively comprise Cordell Independent School District No. 78, Oklahoma's basic financial statements. The Combining Financial Statements are presented for

purposes of additional analysis and are not a required part of the basic financial statements. The Schedule of Expenditures of Federal Awards is presented for purposes of additional analysis as required by U.S. Office of Management and Budget Circular A-133, Audits of States, Local Governments and Non-Profit Organizations, and is not a required part of the basic financial statements.

The Combining Financial Statements and the Schedule of Expenditures of Federal Awards are the responsibility of management and were derived from and relate directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the basic financial statements. Such information has been subjected to the auditing procedures applied in the audit of the fund type and account group financial statements and certain additional procedures, including comparing and reconciling such information directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the basic financial statements or to the basic financial statements themselves, and other additional procedures in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America. In our opinion, except for the financial statements being prepared in compliance with the regulatory basis as prescribed by the Oklahoma State Department of Education as discussed in Note 1, such information is fairly stated, in all material respects, in relation to the basic financial statements as a whole.

***Other Reporting Required by Government Auditing Standards***

In accordance with Government Auditing Standards, we have also issued our report dated January 6, 2016, on our consideration of Cordell Independent School District No. 78, Oklahoma's, internal control over financial reporting and on our tests of its compliance with certain provisions of laws, regulations, contracts and grant agreements and other matters. The purpose of that report is to describe the scope of our testing of internal control over financial reporting and compliance and the results of that testing and not to provide an opinion on internal control over financial reporting or on compliance. That report is an integral part of an audit performed in accordance with Government Auditing Standards in considering Cordell Independent School District No. 78, Oklahoma's internal control over financial reporting and compliance.

1. **Summary of Significant Accounting Policies**

The financial statements of the Cordell Independent School District No. 78 (the "District") have been prepared in conformity with another comprehensive basis of accounting as prescribed by the Oklahoma State Department of Education. The more significant of the District's accounting policies are described below.

**A. Reporting Entity**

The District is a corporate body for public purposes created under Title 70 of the Oklahoma Statutes and accordingly is a separate entity for operating and financial reporting purposes. The District is part of the public school system of Oklahoma under the general direction and control of the State Board of Education and is financially dependent on state of Oklahoma support. The general operating authority for the public school system is the Oklahoma School Code contained in Title 70, Oklahoma Statutes.

The governing body of the District is the Board of Education composed of elected members. The appointed superintendent is the executive officer of the District.

In evaluating how to define the district, for financial reporting purposes, management has considered all potential component units. The decision to include a potential component unit in the reporting entity was made by applying the criteria established by the Governmental Accounting Standards Board (GASB). The basic -- but not the only -- criterion for including a potential component unit within the reporting entity is the governing body's ability to exercise oversight responsibility. The most significant manifestation of this ability is financial interdependency. Other manifestations of the ability to exercise oversight responsibility include, but are not limited to, the selection of governing authority, the designation of management, the ability to significantly influence operations, and accountability for fiscal matters. A second criterion used in evaluating potential component units is the scope of public service. Application of this criterion involves considering whether the activity benefits the District and/or its citizens, or whether the activity is conducted within the geographic boundaries of the District and is generally available to its patrons. A third criterion used to evaluate potential component units for inclusion or exclusion from the reporting entity is the existence of special financing relationships, regardless of whether the District is able to exercise oversight responsibilities. Based upon the application of these criteria, there are no potential component units included in the District's reporting entity.

The School Education Foundation is not included in the reporting entity. The District does not appoint any of the board members or exercise any oversight authority over the Foundation.

**B. Fund Accounting**

The District uses funds and account groups to report on its financial position and the results of its operations. Fund accounting is designed to demonstrate legal compliance and to aid financial management by segregating transactions related to certain district functions or activities.

A fund is a separate accounting entity with a self-balancing set of accounts. An account group, on the other hand, is a financial reporting device designed to provide accountability for certain assets and liabilities that are not recorded in the funds because they do not directly affect net expendable available financial resources.

Funds are classified into three categories: governmental, proprietary and fiduciary. Each category, in turn, is divided into separate "fund types."

**Governmental Fund Types**

Governmental funds are used to account for all or most of a government's general activities, including the collection and disbursement of earmarked monies (Special Revenue Funds), the acquisition or construction of general fixed assets (Capital Projects Funds), and the servicing of general long-term debt (Debt Service Funds).

**General Fund** - The General Fund is used to account for all financial transactions except those required to be accounted for in another fund. Major revenue sources include state and local property taxes and state funding under the Foundation and Incentive Aid Program. Expenditures include all costs associated with the daily operations of the schools except for programs funded for building repairs and maintenance, school construction and debt service on bonds and other long-term debt. The general fund includes federal and state restricted monies that must be expended for specific programs.

**Special Revenue Fund** - The Special Revenue Fund of the District consists of the Building Fund, Child Nutrition Fund, Co-op Fund, and Hunsinger Scholarship Fund.

**Building Fund** - The Building Fund consists of monies derived from property taxes levied for the purpose of erecting, remodeling, or repairing buildings and for purchasing furniture and equipment.

**Fund Accounting, (Continued)**

**Special Revenue Fund, (Continued)**

Child Nutrition Fund - The Child Nutrition Fund consists of monies collected from meals served to students and employees of the District and is expended on food, supplies and salaries. The District also deposits monies received from the National School Lunch and Breakfast programs into this fund.

Co-op Fund - The Co-op Fund consists of monies collected from certain federal grant program resources and contributions from other school districts that voluntarily choose to pool their resources for the purpose of coordinated, multi-district education and related services.

Hunsinger Scholarship Fund - The fund receives its assets by contributions. The principal and interest are available to provide scholarships to selected students.

Debt Service Fund - The Debt Service Fund is the District's Sinking Fund and is used to account for the accumulation of financial resources for the payment of general long-term debt principal, interest and related costs. The primary revenue sources are local property taxes levied specifically for debt service and interest earnings from temporary investments.

Capital Projects Fund - The Capital Projects Fund is the District's Bond Fund and is used to account for the proceeds of bond sales to be used exclusively for acquiring school sites, constructing and equipping new school facilities, renovating existing facilities, and acquiring transportation equipment.

Permanent Fund - Permanent Funds account for restricted resources where the District is under an obligation to maintain the trust principal. The Permanent Fund of the District consists of the Anderson Endowment Fund, Birckett Scholarship Fund and Koehn Scholarship Fund. Although the principal may not be expended, the interest generated from these funds is to be used for scholarships.

**Fiduciary Fund Types**

Fiduciary funds are used to account for assets held on behalf of outside parties, including other governments, or on behalf of other funds within the District. Agency funds generally are used to account for assets that the District holds on behalf of others as their agent and do not involve measurement of results of operations.

**Fund Accounting, (Continued)**

**Agency Fund** - The Agency Fund is the School Activities Fund which is used to account for monies collected principally through fundraising efforts of the students and District-sponsored groups. The administration is responsible, under the authority of the Board, for collecting, disbursing and accounting for these activity funds.

**Account Groups**

Account groups are not funds and consist of a self-balancing set of accounts used only to establish accounting control over long-term debt and general fixed assets not accounted for in proprietary funds

**General Long-Term Debt Account Group** - This account group was established to account for all long-term debt of the District, which is offset by the amount available in the debt service fund and the amount to be provided in future years to complete retirement of the debt principal. It is also used to account for liabilities for compensated absences and early retirement incentives which are to be paid from funds provided in future years.

**General Fixed Asset Account Group** - This account group is used to account for property, plant and equipment of the school district. The District has not maintained the cost of fixed assets purchased in previous years. Thus the General Fixed Asset Account Group is not presented.

**Memorandum Only - Total Column**

The total column on the financial statements is captioned "memorandum only" to indicate that it is presented only to facilitate financial analysis. Data in this column does not present financial position, results of operations or cash flows in conformity with generally accepted accounting principles. Neither is such data comparable to a consolidation. Interfund eliminations have not been made in the aggregation of this data.

**C. Basis of Accounting**

The District prepares its financial statements in a presentation format that is prescribed by the Oklahoma State Department of Education. This format is essentially the generally accepted form of presentation used by state and local governments prior to the effective date of GASB Statement No. 34, *Basic Financial Statements - Management's Discussion and Analysis - for State and Local Governments*. This format differs significantly from that required by GASB Statement No. 34.

**Basis of Accounting, (Continued)**

The basic financial statements are essentially prepared on a basis of cash receipts and disbursements modified as required by the regulations of the Oklahoma State Department of Education as follows:

- Encumbrances represented by purchase orders, contracts and other commitments for the expenditure of monies are recorded as expenditures when approved.
- Investments are recorded as assets when purchased.
- Warrants payable are recorded as liabilities when issued.
- Long-term debt is recorded when incurred.

This regulatory basis of accounting differs from accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America, which require revenues to be recognized when they become available and measurable, or when they are earned, and expenditures or expenses to be recognized when the related liabilities are incurred for governmental fund types.

**D. Budgets and Budgetary Accounting**

The District is required by state law to prepare an annual budget. A preliminary budget must be submitted to the Board of Education by December 31 for the fiscal year beginning the following July 1. If the preliminary budget requires an additional levy, the District must hold an election on the first Tuesday in February to approve the levy. If the preliminary budget does not require an additional levy, it becomes the legal budget. If an election is held and the taxes are approved, then the preliminary budget becomes the legal budget. If voters reject the additional taxes, the District must adopt a budget within the approved tax rate.

The District may upon approval by a majority of the electors of the District voting on the question make the advalorem levy, emergency levy and local support levy permanent.

Under current Oklahoma Statutes, a formal budget is required for all funds except for agency funds. Budgets are presented for all funds that include the originally approved budgeted appropriations for expenditures and final budgeted appropriations as adjusted for supplemental appropriations and approved transfers between budget categories.

**E. Assets, Liabilities and Fund Equity**

**Cash and Cash Equivalents** - The District considers all cash on hand, demand deposits and highly liquid investments, with an original maturity of three months or less when purchased, to be cash and cash equivalents.

**Investments** - Investments consist of direct obligations of the United States Government and Agencies or certificates of deposit with maturities greater than three months when purchased. All investments are recorded at cost, which approximates market value.

**Property Tax Revenues** - The District is authorized by state law to levy property taxes which consist of ad valorem taxes on real and personal property within the District. The County Assessor, upon receipt of the certification of tax levies from the county excise board, extends the tax levies on the tax roll for submission to the county treasurer prior to October 1. The county treasurer must commence tax collection within fifteen days of receipt of the tax rolls. The first half of taxes is due prior to January 1. The second half is due prior to April 1. If the first payment is not made timely, the entire tax becomes due and payable on January 2. Second half taxes become delinquent on April 1 of the year following the year of assessment. If not paid by the following October 1, the property is offered for sale for the amount of taxes due. The owner has two years to redeem the property by paying the taxes and penalty owed. If, at the end of two years, the owner has not done so, the purchaser is issued a deed to the property.

**Inventories** - The value of consumable inventories at June 30, 2015, is not material to the financial statements.

**Fixed Assets and Property, Plant and Equipment** - The General Fixed Asset Account Group is not presented.

**Compensated Absences** - The school does not calculate a dollar value of compensated absences. Thus, compensated absences have not been presented.

**Long-Term Debt** - Long-term debt is recognized as a liability of a governmental fund when due, or when resources have been accumulated in the Debt Service Fund for payment early in the following year. For other long-term obligations, only that portion expected to be financed from expendable available financial resources is reported as a fund liability of a governmental fund. The remaining portion of such obligations is reported in the General Long-Term Debt Account group. Long-term liabilities expected to be financed from proprietary fund operations are accounted for in those funds.

**Cash Fund Balance** - Cash fund balance represents the funds not encumbered by purchase order, legal contracts, and outstanding warrants.

**F. Revenue, Expenses and Expenditures**

**State Revenues** - Revenues from state sources for current operations are primarily governed by the state aid formula under the provisions of Article XVIII, Title 70, Oklahoma Statutes. The State Board of Education administers the allocation of state aid funds to school districts based on information accumulated from the districts.

After review and verification of reports and supporting documentation, the State Department of Education may adjust subsequent fiscal period allocations of money for prior year errors disclosed by review. Normally, such adjustments are treated as reductions or additions of revenue of the year when the adjustment is made.

The District receives revenue from the state to administer certain categorical educational programs. State Board of Education rules require that revenue earmarked for these programs be expended only for the program for which the money is provided and require that the money not expended as of the close of the fiscal year be carried forward into the following year to be expended for the same categorical programs. The State Department of Education requires that categorical, educational program revenues be accounted for in the general fund.

**Interfund Transactions** - Quasi-external transactions are accounted for as revenues, expenditures or expenses. Transactions that constitute reimbursements to a fund or expenditures/expenses initially made from it that are properly applicable to another fund, are recorded as expenditures/expenses in the fund that is reimbursed.

All other interfund transactions, except quasi-external transactions and reimbursements, are reported as transfers. Nonrecurring or non-routine permanent transfers of equity are reported as residual equity transfers. All other interfund transfers are reported as operating transfers. No interfund transactions occurred during fiscal year 2015.

**G. Statement of Cash Flows**

Since the District does not currently have any Proprietary Fund Types, the statement of cash flows has not been presented in the fiscal 2015 accompanying financial statements.

2. **Cash and Investments**

The District's investment policies are governed by state statute. Permissible investments include direct obligations of the United States Government and Agencies; certificates of deposit of savings and loan associations, and bank and trust companies; and savings accounts or savings certificates of savings and loan associations, and trust companies. Collateral is required for demand deposits and certificates of deposit for all amounts not covered by federal deposit insurance.

**Deposits** - The District's cash deposits at June 30, 2015, are categorized to give an indication of the level of risk assumed by the District at year end as follows:

- (A) Insured or collateralized with securities held by the District or by its agent in the District's name
- (B) Collateralized with securities held by the pledging financial institution's trust department or agent in the District's name
- (C) Uncollateralized

**Investments** - The District's investments consist of certificates of deposit or direct obligations of the United States Government and Agencies at June 30, 2015, and are categorized to give an indication of the level of risk assumed by the District.

- 3. **General Long-Term Debt** - State statutes prohibit the District from becoming indebted in an amount exceeding the revenue to be received for any fiscal year without approval by the District's voters. Bond issues have been approved by the voters and issued by the District for various capital improvements.

4. **Investment Income**

Investment income deposits are receipted as allocated by the Treasurer. School District Funds held by the Treasurer are required to be invested in accordance with Title 70 of the Oklahoma Statutes. Interest income on cash funds totaled \$14,107.57.

5. **Risk Management**

The District is exposed to various risks of loss related to torts, theft of, damage to, and destruction of assets, errors and omissions, injuries to employees, employees' health and life, and natural disasters. The District manages these various risks of loss through the purchase of commercial insurance. Management believes such coverage is sufficient to preclude any significant uninsured losses to the District. Settled claims have not exceeded this insurance coverage in any of the past three fiscal years.

6. **Employee Retirement System**

The District participates in the state-administered Oklahoma Teachers' Retirement System (the "System"), which is a cost-sharing, multiple-employer public employee retirement system (PERS). Under the System, contributions are made by the District, the State of Oklahoma, and the participating employees. Participation is required for all teachers and other certified employees and is optional for all other regular employees of public educational institutions who work at least 20 hours per week. A participant's date of membership is the date the first contribution is made to the System. The System is administered by a board of trustees which acts as a fiduciary for investing the funds and governing the administration of the System. The District has no responsibility or authority for the operation and administration of the System nor has it any liability, except for the current contribution requirements.

**Employee Retirement System, (Continued)**

A participant with five years of creditable service may retire with a normal retirement allowance at the age of sixty-two or with reduced benefits as early as age fifty-five. The normal retirement allowance paid monthly for life and then to beneficiaries, if certain options are exercised, equals two percent of the average of the highest three earning years of contributory service multiplied by the number of years of credited service. A participant leaving employment before attaining retirement age, but completing ten years of service, may elect to vest his accumulated contributions and defer receipt of a retirement annuity until a later date. When a participant dies in active service and has completed ten years of credited service, the beneficiary is entitled to a death benefit.

If the beneficiary is a surviving spouse, the surviving spouse may, in lieu of the death benefit, elect to receive, subject to the surviving spousal options, the participant's retirement benefits accrued at the time of death.

The contribution rates for the Districts, which are not actuarially determined, and its employees are established by statute and applied to the employee's earnings, plus employer-paid fringe benefits. The District is required by statute to contribute 9.5% of applicable compensation effective July 1, 2010 and thereafter. The District is allowed by the Oklahoma Teacher's Retirement System to make the required contributions on behalf of the participating members. The required contribution for participating members is 7.0% of each member's total compensation.

For the year ended June 30, 2015, the total compensation covered by the Teacher Retirement System was \$3,187,908.20. The District's contributions to the System for the years ending June 30, 2015, 2014 and 2013 were \$316,036.06, \$318,794.71, and \$298,456.62, respectively.

The System's accounting records are maintained on the cash basis of accounting, except for accruals of interest income.

The pension benefit obligation is a standardized disclosure measure of the present value of pension benefits. This pension valuation method reflects the present value of estimated pension benefits that will be paid in future years as a result of employee services performed to date and is adjusted for the effect of projected salary increases. There are no actuarial valuations performed on individual school districts.

**7. Health Care Coverage**

During the year ended June 30, 2015, employees of the Cordell Independent School District No. 78, Oklahoma, were covered by a health insurance plan (the Plan). The teachers and support personnel may elect to be covered by the Plan. The school contributes 100 percent of the cost of single coverage towards the Plan for all non-certified and certified personnel. The Plan was authorized by House Bill 1731, 1988 Oklahoma Legislature (74 O.S. 1988, Supp. Section 1301-1322) with the Oklahoma State and Education Employers Group Insurance Board.

**8. Contingencies**

Amounts received or receivable from grantor agencies are subject to audit and adjustment by grantor agencies. Any disallowed claims, including amounts already collected, may constitute a liability of the applicable funds. The amount, if any, of expenditures which may be disallowed by the grantor cannot be determined at this time, although the District expects such amounts, if any, to be immaterial.

As stated in our report, the financial statements were prepared in compliance with the cash basis as prescribed by the Oklahoma State Department of Education, which is a comprehensive basis of accounting other than accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America. In our report, our opinion was qualified because the omission of the General Fixed Assets Account Group results in an incomplete presentation.

***Internal Control Over Financial Reporting***

In planning and performing our audit of the financial statements, we considered Cordell Independent School District No. 78, Oklahoma's internal control over financial reporting (internal control) to determine the audit procedures that are appropriate in the circumstances for the purpose of expressing our opinion on the financial statements, but not for the purpose of expressing an opinion on the effectiveness of the entity's internal control. Accordingly, we do not express an opinion on the effectiveness of the entity's internal control.

*A deficiency in internal control* exists when the design or operation of a control does not allow management or employees, in the normal course of performing their assigned functions, to prevent, or detect and correct misstatements on a timely basis. *A material weakness* is a deficiency, or a combination of deficiencies, in internal control such that there is a reasonable possibility that a material misstatement of the entity's financial statements will not be prevented, or detected and corrected on a timely basis. *A significant deficiency* is a deficiency, or a combination of deficiencies, in internal control that is less severe than a material weakness, yet important enough to merit attention by those charged with governance.

Our consideration of internal control was for the limited purpose described in the first paragraph of this section and was not designed to identify all deficiencies in internal control that might be material weaknesses or significant deficiencies. Given these limitations, during our audit we did not identify any deficiencies in internal control that we consider to be material weaknesses. However, material weaknesses may exist that have not been identified.

### *Compliance and Other Matters*

However, providing an opinion on compliance with those provisions was not an objective of our audit, and accordingly, we do not express such an opinion. The results of our tests disclosed no instances of noncompliance or other matters that are required to be reported under *Government Auditing Standards* in the United States of America.

However, we noted certain matters that we have reported to the Board of Education and administrative employees of Cordell Independent School District No. 78, Oklahoma, in a separate statement of audit comments included with this report.

### *Purpose of this Report*

The purpose of this report is solely to describe the scope of our testing of internal control and compliance and the results of that testing, and not to provide an opinion on the effectiveness of the entity's internal control or on compliance. This report is an integral part of an audit performed in accordance with *Government Auditing Standards* in considering the entity's internal control and compliance. *A deficiency in internal control over compliance* exists when the design or operation of a control over compliance does not allow management or employees, in the normal course of performing their assigned functions, to prevent, or detect and correct, noncompliance with a type of compliance requirement of a federal program on a timely basis. *A material weakness in internal control over compliance* is a deficiency, or combination of deficiencies, in internal control over compliance, such that there is a reasonable possibility that material noncompliance with a type of compliance requirement of a federal program will not be prevented, or detected and corrected, on a timely basis. *A significant deficiency in internal control over compliance* is a deficiency, or a combination of deficiencies, in internal control over compliance with a type of compliance requirement of a federal program that is less severe than a material weakness in internal control over compliance, yet important enough to merit attention by those charged with governance.

Our consideration of internal control over compliance was for the limited purpose described in the first paragraph of this section and was not designed to identify all deficiencies in internal control over compliance that might be material weaknesses or significant deficiencies. We did not identify any deficiencies in internal control over compliance that we consider to be material weaknesses. However, material weaknesses may exist that have not been identified.

The purpose of this report on internal control over compliance is solely to describe the scope of our testing of internal control over compliance and the results of that testing based on the requirements of OMB Circular A-133. Accordingly, this report is not suitable for any other purpose.

Fundraisers, etc. should have individual receipts written to students turning in monies. Gates, raffles, carnivals, etc. should have a cash count sheet signed by two individuals to account for all monies received. When applicable, tickets with beginning and ending numbers should be noted on the cash count sheet and retained. Documentation such as cash register printouts or other supporting documentation should be attached where applicable.

PRIOR YEAR

- 14-1 During our audit of the payroll records, we noted instances of extra duty pay where the remuneration for services exceeded \$500.00 but the District did not have a written extra duty contract as required by Title 70 Section 5-123 of the Oklahoma Statutes. No expenditure involving an amount greater than \$500.00 shall be made by a board of education except in accordance with the provisions of a written contract.
- 14-2 During our audit of the Activity Fund, we noted instances where individual receipts should have been present but were not. Fundraisers, etc. should have individual receipts written to students turning in monies. Gates, raffles, carnivals, etc. should have a cash count sheet signed by two individuals to account for all monies received. When applicable, tickets with beginning and ending numbers should be noted on the cash count sheet and retained. Documentation such as cash register printouts or other supporting documentation should be attached where applicable.
- 14-3 During our audit of the Activity Fund, we noted instances where money being receipted by Activity Fund sponsors was not being forwarded to the Activity Fund custodian on a timely basis. Per Title 70 O.S. Section 5-129, state law requires that sponsors forward their money daily to the Activity Fund custodian.

The District implemented procedures to correct prior year comments 14-1 and 14-3. However there were instances of reoccurrence of prior year comment 14-2.

Current Year:

15-1 -Receipts for activity fund were not present. Fundraisers, etc. should have individual receipts written to students turning in money.

Receipts for activity fund fundraisers were also an issue on the audit on October 20, 2014. We met with all activity account sponsors after the audit for FY14 as well as going into FY15. I stressed the importance of the "paper trail" that receipts create.

In these meetings we required each sponsor to turn in a spreadsheet or some type of ledger that listed all of the money that students had received. Some sponsors took this requirement and interpreted in a way as that they did not have to write individual receipts. This was an error on my part; it has since been corrected. Activity sponsors are now writing receipts for all monies received and we are monitoring to make sure that receipts are written.

May this letter serve as the response to your audit comments for the audit that you conducted for Cordell Public Schools on Tuesday, October 20, 2014.

Current Year:

14-1 -*Instances of extra duty pay where services exceeded \$500.00 but the district did not have a written extra duty contract.*

This was an oversight on our part due to some employees receiving pay for more than one extra duty assignment. An example is an employee who works in our concession stands as well as receives pay for keeping the scorers book during basketball games. I simply failed to see that she would make more than \$500.00.

In the future, contracts will be made and board approved for any amount over the employees actual contract amount.

14-2 -*Receipts for activity fund were not present. Fundraisers, etc. should have individual receipts written to students turning in money.*

Since the audit on October 20, 2014 I have met with all activity account sponsors. I stressed the importance of the "paper trail" that receipts create. In talking with the activity fund custodian, we have decided to "spot" check some activity accounts throughout the year to ensure compliance. I will keep a closer eye on this issue.

14-3 -*Instances where money being receipted by activity fund sponsors was not forwarded to the activity fund custodian in a timely basis.*

Again, I held a meeting with all activity sponsors after our audit and stressed the importance of forwarding this money to the custodian daily. I gave them some ideas on larger fund raisers etc. We will do some "spot" checking on this issue as well.
