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**INDEPENDENT AUDITOR'S REPORT
ON THE BASIC FINANCIAL STATEMENTS**

The Honorable Board of Education
Dover Independent School District No. 2
Dover, Kingfisher County, Oklahoma

We have audited the accompanying fund type and account group financial statements of Dover Independent School District No. 2, Oklahoma, as listed in the table of contents, as of and for the year ended June 30, 2012. These financial statements are the responsibility of Dover Independent School District No. 2, Oklahoma. Our responsibility is to express an opinion on these financial statements based on our audit.

We conducted our audit in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America and the standards applicable to financial audits contained in Government Auditing Standards, issued by the Comptroller General of the United States. Those standards require that we plan and perform the audit to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements are free of material misstatement. An audit includes examining, on a test basis, evidence supporting the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements. An audit also includes assessing the accounting principles used and significant estimates made by management, as well as evaluating the overall financial statement presentation. We believe that our audit provides a reasonable basis for our opinion.

As discussed in Note 1, Dover Independent School District No. 2, Oklahoma, prepares its financial statements in conformity with the accounting and financial reporting regulations prescribed or permitted by the Oklahoma State Department of Education, which is a comprehensive basis of accounting other than accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America. The differences between the regulatory basis of accounting and accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America are also described in Note 1.

As discussed in Note 1, the financial statements referred to above do not include the general fixed asset account group. The amount that should be recorded in the general fixed asset account group is not known.

In our opinion, because of the School's policy to prepare its financial statements on the basis of accounting discussed in the third paragraph, the financial statements referred to above do not present fairly, in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America, the financial position of Dover Independent School District No. 2, Oklahoma, as of June 30, 2012, or the results of its operations for the year then ended.

However, in our opinion, except for the omission of the general fixed asset account group as discussed in the fourth paragraph, the financial statements referred to above present fairly, in all material respects, the cash and unencumbered cash balances arising from regulatory basis transactions of each fund type and account group of Dover Independent School District No. 2, Oklahoma, as of June 30, 2012, and the revenues it received and expenditures it paid for the year then ended, on the regulatory basis of accounting described in Note 1.

In accordance with Government Auditing Standards, we have also issued our report dated December 12, 2012, on our consideration of Dover Independent School District No. 2, Oklahoma's, internal control over financial reporting and our tests of its compliance with certain provisions of laws, regulations, contracts and grant agreements and other matters. The purpose of that report is to describe the scope of our testing of internal control over financial reporting and compliance and the results of that testing and not to provide an opinion on the internal control over financial reporting or on compliance. That report is an integral part of an audit performed in accordance with Government Auditing Standards and should be considered in assessing the results of our audit.

Our audit was conducted for the purpose of forming an opinion on the fund type and account group financial statements of Dover Independent School District No. 2, Oklahoma, taken as a whole. The accompanying Combining Financial Statements and the Schedule of Expenditures of Federal Awards as listed in the accompanying Table of Contents are presented for purposes of additional analysis and are not a required part of the financial statements. The Combining Financial Statements and the Schedule of Expenditures of Federal Awards are the responsibility of management and were derived from and relate directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements. Such information has been subjected to the auditing procedures applied in the audit of the fund type and account group financial statements referred to above and certain additional procedures, including comparing and reconciling such information directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements or to the financial statements themselves, and other additional procedures in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America. In our opinion, except for the financial statements being prepared in compliance with the regulatory basis as prescribed by the Oklahoma State Department of Education as discussed in Note 1, such information is fairly stated, in all material respects, in relation to the financial statements taken as a whole.

1. **Summary of Significant Accounting Policies**

The basic financial statements of the Dover Independent School District No. 2 (the "District") have been prepared in conformity with another comprehensive basis of accounting as prescribed by the Oklahoma State Department of Education. The more significant of the District's accounting policies are described below.

A. Reporting Entity

The District is a corporate body for public purposes created under Title 70 of the Oklahoma Statutes and accordingly is a separate entity for operating and financial reporting purposes. The District is part of the public school system of Oklahoma under the general direction and control of the State Board of Education and is financially dependent on state of Oklahoma support. The general operating authority for the public school system is the Oklahoma School Code contained in Title 70, Oklahoma Statutes.

The governing body of the District is the Board of Education composed of five elected members. The appointed superintendent is the executive officer of the District.

In evaluating how to define the district, for financial reporting purposes, management has considered all potential component units. The decision to include a potential component unit in the reporting entity was made by applying the criteria established by the Governmental Accounting Standards Board (GASB). The basic -- but not the only -- criterion for including a potential component unit within the reporting entity is the governing body's ability to exercise oversight responsibility. The most significant manifestation of this ability is financial interdependency. Other manifestations of the ability to exercise oversight responsibility include, but are not limited to, the selection of governing authority, the designation of management, the ability to significantly influence operations, and accountability for fiscal matters. A second criterion used in evaluating potential component units is the scope of public service. Application of this criterion involves considering whether the activity benefits the District and/or its citizens, or whether the activity is conducted within the geographic boundaries of the District and is generally available to its patrons. A third criterion used to evaluate potential component units for inclusion or exclusion from the reporting entity is the existence of special financing relationships, regardless of whether the District is able to exercise oversight responsibilities. Based upon the application of these criteria, there are no potential component units included in the District's reporting entity.

Reporting Entity, (Continued)

The School Education Foundation is not included in the reporting entity. The District does not appoint any of the board members or exercise any oversight authority over the Foundation.

B. Fund Accounting

The District uses funds and account groups to report on its financial position and the results of its operations. Fund accounting is designed to demonstrate legal compliance and to aid financial management by segregating transactions related to certain district functions or activities.

A fund is a separate accounting entity with a self-balancing set of accounts. An account group, on the other hand, is a financial reporting device designed to provide accountability for certain assets and liabilities that are not recorded in the funds because they do not directly affect net expendable available financial resources.

Funds are classified into three categories: governmental, proprietary and fiduciary. Each category, in turn, is divided into separate "fund types."

Governmental Fund Types

Governmental funds are used to account for all or most of a government's general activities, including the collection and disbursement of earmarked monies (special revenue funds), the acquisition or construction of general fixed assets (capital projects funds), and the servicing of general long-term debt (debt service funds).

General Fund - The general fund is used to account for all financial transactions except those required to be accounted for in another fund. Major revenue sources include state and local property taxes and state funding under the Foundation and Incentive Aid Program. Expenditures include all costs associated with the daily operations of the schools except for programs funded for building repairs and maintenance, school construction and debt service on bonds and other long-term debt. The general fund includes federal and state restricted monies that must be expended for specific programs.

Special Revenue Fund - The Special Revenue Fund of the District consists of the Building Fund and the Child Nutrition Fund.

Special Revenue Fund, (Continued)

Building Fund - The Building Fund consists of monies derived from property taxes levied for the purpose of erecting, remodeling, or repairing buildings and for purchasing furniture and equipment.

Child Nutrition Fund - The Child Nutrition Fund consists of monies collected from meals served to students and employees of the district and is expended on food, supplies and salaries. The district also deposits monies received from the National School Lunch and Breakfast programs into this fund.

Debt Service Fund - The Debt Service Fund is the District's Sinking Fund and is used to account for the accumulation of financial resources for the payment of general long-term debt principal, interest and related costs. The primary revenue sources are local property taxes levied specifically for debt service and interest earnings from temporary investments

Capital Projects Fund - The Capital Projects Fund is the District's Bond Fund and is used to account for the proceeds of bond sales to be used exclusively for acquiring schools sites, constructing and equipping new school facilities, renovating existing facilities, and acquiring transportation equipment.

Fiduciary Fund Types

Fiduciary funds are used to account for assets held on behalf of outside parties, including other governments, or on behalf of other funds within the District. Agency funds generally are used to account for assets that the District holds on behalf of others as their agent and do not involve measurement of results of operations.

Agency Fund - The Agency Fund is the School Activities Fund which is used to account for monies collected principally through fundraising efforts of the students and District-sponsored groups. The administration is responsible, under the authority of the Board, for collecting, disbursing and accounting for these activity funds.

Fund Accounting, (Continued)

Account Groups

Account groups are not funds and consist of a self-balancing set of accounts used only to establish accounting control over long-term debt and general fixed assets not accounted for in proprietary funds.

General Long-Term Debt Account Group - This account group was established to account for all long-term debt of the District, which is offset by the amount available in the debt service fund and the amount to be provided in future years to complete retirement of the debt principal. It is also used to account for liabilities for compensated absences and early retirement incentives which are to be paid from funds provided in future years.

General Fixed Asset Account Group - This account group is used to account for property, plant and equipment of the school district. The District has not maintained the cost of fixed assets purchased in previous years. Thus the General Fixed Asset Account Group is not presented.

Memorandum Only - Total Column

The total column on the financial statements is captioned "memorandum only" to indicate that it is presented only to facilitate financial analysis. Data in this column does not present financial position, results of operations or cash flows in conformity with generally accepted accounting principles. Neither is such data comparable to a consolidation. Interfund eliminations have not been made in the aggregation of this data.

C. Basis of Accounting

The District prepares its financial statements in a presentation format that is prescribed by the Oklahoma State Department of Education. This format is essentially the generally accepted form of presentation used by state and local governments prior to the effective date of GASB Statement No. 34, *Basic Financial Statements - Management's Discussion and Analysis - for State and Local Governments*. This format differs significantly from that required by GASB Statement No. 34.

Basis of Accounting, (Continued)

The basic financial statements are essentially prepared on a basis of cash receipts and disbursements modified as required by the regulations of the Oklahoma State Department of Education as follows:

- Encumbrances represented by purchase orders, contracts and other commitments for the expenditure of monies are recorded as expenditures when approved.
- Investments are recorded as assets when purchased.
- Warrants payable are recorded as liabilities when issued.
- Long-term debt is recorded when incurred.

This regulatory basis of accounting differs from accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America, which require revenues to be recognized when they become available and measurable, or when they are earned, and expenditures or expenses to be recognized when the related liabilities are incurred for governmental fund types.

D. Budgets and Budgetary Accounting

The District is required by state law to prepare an annual budget. A preliminary budget must be submitted to the Board of Education by December 31 for the fiscal year beginning the following July 1. If the preliminary budget requires an additional levy, the District must hold an election on the first Tuesday in February to approve the levy. If the preliminary budget does not require an additional levy, it becomes the legal budget. If an election is held and the taxes are approved, then the preliminary budget becomes the legal budget. If voters reject the additional taxes, the District must adopt a budget within the approved tax rate.

The District may upon approval by a majority of the electors of the District voting on the question make the ad valorem levy, emergency levy and local support levy permanent.

Under current Oklahoma Statutes, a formal budget is required for all funds except for agency funds. Budgets are presented for all funds that include the originally approved budgeted appropriations for expenditures and final budgeted appropriations as adjusted for supplemental appropriations and approved transfers between budget categories.

E. Assets, Liabilities and Fund Equity

Cash and Cash Equivalents - For purposes of the statement of cash flows, the District considers all cash on hand, demand deposits and highly liquid investments, with an original maturity of three months or less when purchased, to be cash and cash equivalents.

Investments - Investments consist of direct obligations of the United States Government and Agencies or certificates of deposit with maturities greater than three months when purchased. All investments are recorded at cost, which approximates market value.

Property Tax Revenues - The District is authorized by state law to levy property taxes which consist of ad valorem taxes on real and personal property within the District. The County Assessor, upon receipt of the certification of tax levies from the county excise board, extends the tax levies on the tax roll for submission to the county treasurer prior to October 1. The county treasurer must commence tax collection within fifteen days of receipt of the tax rolls. The first half of taxes is due prior to January 1. The second half is due prior to April 1.

If the first payment is not made timely, the entire tax becomes due and payable on January 2. Second half taxes become delinquent on April 1 of the year following the year of assessment. If not paid by the following October 1, the property is offered for sale for the amount of taxes due. The owner has two years to redeem the property by paying the taxes and penalty owed. If, at the end of two years, the owner has not done so, the purchaser is issued a deed to the property.

Inventories - The value of consumable inventories at June 30, 2012 is not material to the basic financial statements.

Fixed Assets and Property, Plant and Equipment - The General Fixed Asset Account Group is not presented.

Compensated Absences - The school does not calculate a dollar value of compensated absences. Thus, compensated absences have not been presented.

Cash Fund Balance - Cash fund balance represents the funds not encumbered by purchase order, legal contracts, and outstanding warrants.

F. Revenue, Expenses and Expenditures

State Revenues - Revenues from state sources for current operations are primarily governed by the state aid formula under the provisions of Article XVIII, Title 70, Oklahoma Statutes. The State Board of Education administers the allocation of state aid funds to school districts based on information accumulated from the districts.

After review and verification of reports and supporting documentation, the State Department of Education may adjust subsequent fiscal period allocations of money for prior year errors disclosed by review. Normally, such adjustments are treated as reductions or additions of revenue of the year when the adjustment is made.

The District receives revenue from the state to administer certain categorical educational programs. State Board of Education rules require that revenue earmarked for these programs be expended only for the program for which the money is provided and require that the money not expended as of the close of the fiscal year be carried forward into the following year to be expended for the same categorical programs. The State Department of Education requires that categorical, educational program revenues be accounted for in the general fund.

Interfund Transactions - Quasi-external transactions are accounted for as revenues, expenditures or expenses. Transactions that constitute reimbursements to a fund or expenditures/expenses initially made from it that are properly applicable to another fund, are recorded as expenditures/expenses in the fund that is reimbursed.

All other interfund transactions, except quasi-external transactions and reimbursements, are reported as transfers. Nonrecurring or non-routine permanent transfers of equity are reported as residual equity transfers. All other interfund transfers are reported as operating transfers. There were no operating transfers or residual equity transfers during the fiscal year ended June 30, 2012.

G. Statement of Cash Flows

Since the District does not currently have any Proprietary Fund Types, the statement of cash flows has not been presented in the fiscal year 2012 accompanying financial statements.

2. **Cash and Investments**

The District's investment policies are governed by state statute. Permissible investments include direct obligations of the United States Government and Agencies; certificates of deposit of savings and loan associations, and bank and trust companies; and savings accounts or savings certificates of savings and loan associations, and trust companies. Collateral is required for demand deposits and certificates of deposit for all amounts not covered by federal deposit insurance.

Deposits - The District's cash deposits at June 30, 2012, are categorized to give an indication of the level of risk assumed by the District at year end as follows:

3. General Long-Term Debt

State Statutes prohibit the District from becoming indebted in an amount exceeding the revenue to be received for any fiscal year without approval by the District's voters. Bond issues have been approved by the voters and issued by the District for various capital improvements. These bonds are required to be fully paid serially within 25 years from the date of issue.

General long-term debt of the District consists of bonds payable. Obligations for capital leases, compensated absences, and early retirement incentives have not been presented. Debt service requirements for bonds payable are solely from fund balance and future revenues of the Debt Service Fund.

Interest expense on general long-term debt incurred during the current year totaled \$6,160.00.

4. Employee Retirement System

The District participates in the state-administered Oklahoma Teachers' Retirement System (the "System"), which is a cost-sharing, multiple-employer public employee retirement system (PERS). Under the System, contributions are made by the District, the State of Oklahoma, and the participating employees. Participation is required for all teachers and other certified employees and is optional for all other regular employees of public educational institutions who work at least 20 hours per week. A participant's date of membership is the date the first contribution is made to the System. The System is administered by a board of trustees which acts as a fiduciary for investing the funds and governing the administration of the System. The District has no responsibility or authority for the operation and administration of the System nor has it any liability, except for the current contribution requirements.

A participant with five years of creditable service may retire with a normal retirement allowance at the age of sixty-two or with reduced benefits as early as age fifty-five. The normal retirement allowance paid monthly for life and then to beneficiaries, if certain options are exercised, equals two percent of the average of the highest three earning years of contributory service multiplied by the number of years of credited service.

A participant leaving employment before attaining retirement age, but completing ten years of service, may elect to vest his accumulated contributions and defer receipt of a retirement annuity until a later date. When a participant dies in active service and has completed ten years of credited service, the beneficiary is entitled to a death benefit.

If the beneficiary is a surviving spouse, the surviving spouse may, in lieu of the death benefit, elect to receive, subject to the surviving spousal options, the participant's retirement benefits accrued at the time of death.

The contribution rates for the Districts, which are not actuarially determined, and its employees are established by statute and applied to the employee's earnings, plus employer-paid fringe benefits. The District is required by statute to contribute 9.5% of applicable compensation effective July 1, 2010 and thereafter. The District is allowed by the Oklahoma Teacher's Retirement System to make the required contributions on behalf of the participating members. The required contribution for participating members is 7.0% of each member's total compensation.

For the year ended June 30, 2012, the total compensation covered by the Teacher Retirement System was \$947,785.38. The District's contributions to the System for the years ending June 30, 2012, 2011, and 2010 were \$90,039.84, \$98,262.33, and \$159,784.00, respectively.

The pension benefit obligation is a standardized disclosure measure of the present value of pension benefits. This pension valuation method reflects the present value of estimated pension benefits that will be paid in future years as a result of employee services performed to date and is adjusted for the effect of projected salary increases. There are no actuarial valuations performed on individual school districts. The non-funded pension benefit obligation of the System, as determined as part of the latest actuarial valuation dated June 30, 2011, is as follows:

Ten year historical trend information is presented in the Teacher's Retirement System of Oklahoma Annual Report for the year ended June 30, 2011. This information is useful in assessing the pension plan's accumulation of sufficient assets to pay pension benefits as they become due. The Oklahoma Teachers' Retirement System issues a publicly available financial report that includes financial statements and required supplementary information for the System. 5. **Health Care Coverage**

During the year ended June 30, 2012, employees of the Dover Independent School District No. 2, Oklahoma, were covered by a health insurance plan (the plan). The teachers and support personnel may elect to be covered by the plan. The plan was authorized by House Bill 1731, 1988 Oklahoma Legislature (74 O.S. 1988, Supp. Section 1301-1322) with the Oklahoma State and Education Employers Group Insurance Board.

6. **Investment Income**

Investment income deposits are receipted as allocated by the Treasurer. School District Funds held by the Treasurer are required to be invested in accordance with Title 70 of the Oklahoma Statutes. Interest income on cash funds totaled \$864.51.

7. **Contingencies**

Amounts received or receivable from grantor agencies are subject to audit and adjustment by grantor agencies. Any disallowed claims, including amounts already collected, may constitute a liability of the applicable funds. The amount, if any, of expenditures which may be disallowed by the grantor cannot be determined at this time, although the District expects such amounts, if any, to be immaterial.

8. **Risk Management**

The District is exposed to various risks of loss related to torts, theft of, damage to, and destruction of assets, errors and omissions, injuries to employees, employees' health and life, and natural disasters. The District manages these various risks of loss through the purchase of commercial insurance. Management believes such coverage is sufficient to preclude any significant uninsured losses to the District. Settled claims have not exceeded this insurance coverage in any of the past three fiscal years.

9. **Surety Bonds**

The District has a public employee position bond covering the lunch room attendant for \$5,000.00, the Encumbrance Clerk for \$5,000.00, the Activity Fund Clerk for \$5,000.00, the Principal for \$5,000.00, the Minutes Clerk for \$5,000.00 and the Superintendent for \$100,000.00. The bond is written by Western Surety Company, bond number 18169306, for the penal sum of \$125,000.00 for the term of November 11, 2010 to November 1, 2011 and November 11, 2011 to November 11, 2012.

10. **Subsequent Events**

Management has evaluated subsequent events through December 12, 2012, which is the date the financial statements were available to be issued and have determined that no additional information needs to be added to the financial statements.

We have audited the financial statements of Dover Independent School District No. 2, Dover, Oklahoma, as of and for the year ended June 30, 2012, and have issued our report thereon dated December 12, 2012. As stated in our report, the financial statements were prepared in compliance with the cash basis as prescribed by the Oklahoma State Department of Education, which is a comprehensive basis of accounting other than accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America. In our report, our opinion was qualified because the omission of the General Fixed Assets Account Group results in an incomplete presentation. We conducted our audit in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America and the standards applicable to financial audits contained in *Government Auditing Standards*, issued by the Comptroller General of the United States.

Internal Control Over Financial Reporting

In planning and performing our audit, we considered Dover Independent School District No. 2, Oklahoma's internal control over financial reporting as a basis for designing our auditing procedures for the purpose of expressing our opinion on the financial statements, but not for the purpose of expressing an opinion on the effectiveness of the entity's internal control over financial reporting. Accordingly, we do not express an opinion on the effectiveness of the entity's internal control over financial reporting.

A deficiency in internal control exists when the design or operation of a control does not allow management or employees, in the normal course of performing their assigned functions, to prevent, or detect and correct misstatements on a timely basis. A material weakness is a deficiency, or a combination of deficiencies, in internal control such that there is a reasonable possibility that a material misstatement of the entity's financial statements will not be prevented, or detected and corrected on a timely basis.

Our consideration of internal control over financial reporting was for the limited purpose described in the first paragraph of this section and was not designed to identify all deficiencies in internal control over financial reporting that might be deficiencies, significant deficiencies or material weaknesses. We did not identify any deficiencies in internal control over financial reporting that we consider to be material weaknesses, as defined above.

Compliance and Other Matters

As part of obtaining reasonable assurance about whether Dover Independent School District No. 2, Dover, Oklahoma's financial statements are free of material misstatement, we performed tests of its compliance with certain provisions of laws, regulations, contracts and grant agreements, noncompliance with which could have a direct and material effect on the determination of financial statement amounts. However, providing an opinion on compliance with those provisions was not an objective of our audit and, accordingly, we do not express such an opinion. The results of our tests disclosed no instances of noncompliance or other matters that are required to be reported under *Government Auditing Standards* in the United States of America.

However, we noted certain matters that we have reported to the Board of Education and administrative employees of Dover Independent School District No. 2, Oklahoma, in a separate statement of audit comments included with this report.

This report is intended solely for the information and use of the Board of Education and administrative employees, and all applicable county, state and federal agencies and is not intended to be and should not be used by anyone other than these specified parties.

CURRENT YEAR

- 12-1. During our audit of the General Fund, we noted instances where amounts were paid without having sufficient documentation for the expenditure. Some purchase orders had statements or quotes but no invoice attached. This allowed an overpayment to one company in the amount of \$3,497.60. No payments should be made to vendors until all supporting documentation is obtained, which should include the original itemized invoice.
- 12-2. During our audit, we noted that the updated Oklahoma Cost Accounting System coding in the Child Nutrition Fund was not used at all times. Although the Child Nutrition funds were properly spent, they should have been classified as federal project program expenditures in the District's accounting records. Policies should be implemented to use accurate and updated OCAS coding as set out by the Oklahoma State Department of Education.
- 12-3. During our audit of the General Fund, Building Fund, Child Nutrition Fund, and Activity Fund, we noted instances where invoices were not signed to verify receipt of goods or services. The person receiving goods or services should sign the invoice, statement, or delivery ticket to indicate that the goods or services were received and in good condition.
- 12-4. During our audit of the Activity Fund, we noted that money being collected by sponsors was not being forwarded to the Activity Fund custodian on a timely basis. Per Title 70 Section 5-129 of the Oklahoma Statutes, state law requires that sponsors forward their money daily to the Activity Fund custodian.
- 12-5. During our audit of the General Fund, Building Fund and Activity Fund we found instances where consecutively numbered purchase orders were not issued in time/date sequence. Purchase orders should be consecutively numbered and issued in time/date sequence. All purchase orders must be approved by the purchasing agent to allow any purchase to be made or any order placed. Funds are not to be obligated without authorization by the purchasing agent. The person obligating these funds without approval can be held liable to pay for the purchases.
- 12-6. During our audit of the payroll records, we noted instances where the District had not issued 1099's to each person or business (excluding corporations) to whom at least \$600.00 was paid for rents or services in the course of business as required by the Internal Revenue Service.

12-7. During our audit of the federal programs, we noted instances where the federal expenditure codes were not being used in the School's accounting system. There should have been federal expenditures coded in the accounting system for Medicaid Resources and there were none. Amounts reported in the Oklahoma Cost Accounting System for each federal project must match what is claimed and reimbursed and school personnel should monitor the revenue and expenditure codes for accuracy.

PRIOR YEAR

11-1. During our audit of the General Fund, Building Fund, and Child Nutrition Fund, we noted instances where invoices were dated before the actual purchase orders were approved. All purchase orders must be approved by the purchasing agent to allow any purchases to be made, any service to be provided, or any order placed. Funds are not to be obligated without authorization by the purchasing agent.

11-2. During our audit of the Activity Fund, we noted instances where invoices were not signed to verify receipt of goods or services. The person receiving goods or services should sign the invoice, statement, or delivery ticket to indicate that the goods or services were received and in good condition.

11-3. During our audit of the Activity Fund, we noted that money being collected by sponsors was not being forwarded to the Activity Fund custodian on a timely basis. Per Title 70 Section 5-129 of the Oklahoma Statutes, state law requires that sponsors forward their money daily to the Activity Fund custodian.

11-4. During the audit of the Activity Fund, we found one subaccount, the General Fund Refund, which had a deficit balance at June 30, 2011. Oklahoma statutes do not allow subaccounts to have deficit balances. Action should be taken to ensure that all subaccount have positive balances at all times.

11-5. During the audit of the payroll records, we noted that the new hire reporting form was not being completed as required by state law. New hire forms should be completed and kept on file for all new employees.

11-6. During our audit of the federal programs, we found that equipment purchased with federal funds was not properly labeled as required by the federal program guidelines. All equipment purchased with federal funds should be labeled with the name of the federal program and the fiscal year the equipment was purchased.

PRIOR YEAR , (CONTINUED)

11-7. During our audit of the federal programs, we noted instances where revenues and expenses were misclassified in the School's accounting system. Two receipts totaling \$7,494.12 that should have been coded to federal projects were coded to local and state revenue codes. There were also instances where local revenues were coded to federal codes totaling \$5,556.79. In addition, there should have been federal expenditures coded in the accounting system for the following programs: project 456, Job Training, project 698, Medicaid Resources, and project 643, ARRA IDEA Preschool Part B and there were none. Also, expenditures coded to project 782, ARRA, Education Stabilization Fund were in excess of the amount reimbursed as federal revenues. Amounts reported in the Oklahoma Cost Accounting System for each federal project must match what is claimed and reimbursed and school personnel should monitor the revenue and expenditure codes for accuracy.

The District has implemented procedures to correct numbers 11-1, 11-4, 11-5, and 11-6 of the prior year's Audit Comments. However, there were instances of reoccurrence in the current fiscal year of comment numbers 11-2, 11-3, and 11-7.



The Dover Public School Administration will ensure that all new hire reporting forms be completed as required by state law. They should be kept on file for all new employees.


11-6 Federal Programs
