Remarks

COVERAGE OF THIS REPORT

The financial reporting entity for which information is to be presented should comply with generally accepted accounting principles for governments. - Expenditure from improvements at part II. Report as capital outlay.
- Interest paid on special assessment obligations as part II, Item 19e.
- Transactions of special assessment bonds at part V.
- Cash and security holdings of special assessment funds at part VI.

Part IV - SALARIES, WAGES, AND FORCE ACCT.

Report salaries and wages for all employees full- and part-time. Include salaries paid for employees of any utility owned and operated by your government. Report salaries in gross amounts before deductions for income taxes, Social Security, or retirement coverage.

Part V — DEBT OUTSTANDING, ISSUED & RETIRED

Also include industrial revenue or pollution control bonds, if issued by your city or town.
